INTERACTIVE SESSIONS

In February, WARIF organised a successful interactive session with the Lagos State law enforcement to establish a strong collaboration between the foundation and law enforcement. Dr. DaSilva emphasised the importance to the Nigerian Police Force of sending all cases of sexual assault and rape seen at the stations to referral centres such as the WARIF Centre in Yaba, where adequate medical treatment and counseling can be given.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMME FOR SECONDARY SCHOOLS - PHASE 1

The first phase of our educational programme to secondary school students will kick off with a survey of 1000 boys and girls in 3 local government areas in Lagos State to gain a better understanding of their perceptions about sexuality, rape and sexual assault.

Followed by an on-site 6 week WARIF educational school program (WESP) consisting of specific extra-curricular content /activities to be introduced to the existing school curriculum, in selected schools, to educate the adolescent youths on gender based violence and the issues that surround this..
