Building Exterior

The Centre has a main entrance as well as 3 additional exits doors situated in key areas around the building. These serve as emergency exit doors as well as encourages the confidentiality and ease of access for clients entering and leaving the building. The Centre find a balance of delivering security, functionality and delight.

A well-positioned signage was placed at the entrance to the WARIF centre; signifying where the Centre is for ease of location on the street. The gatehouse was fully renovated to provide comfort for the security guards available 24 hours each day. Additional standard safety features and signs are also in place such as adequate lighting and fire emergency drills.
