THE WESP Initiative was successfully concluded in this quarter with the implementation of the WARIF Curriculum in selected schools to reduce the prevalence and educate on the prevention of gender based violence amongst secondary school children. The curriculum was extended to parents as well as the children from these selected schools and had an immediate positive measured impact on both target populations.
