All 3 pillars have had an impactful second quarter with April marking the annual Sexual Assault Awareness Month #SAAM.

Some of the initiatives implemented include:

The WARIF Rape Crisis Centre continues to see and record more cases daily at the facility and our trained forensic medical examiners have served as expert witnesses in on-going court cases, ensuring all women and girls receive the justice they rightly deserve. This important service is now further enhanced with the launch of the WARIF Legal Clinic in partnership with our in -house counsel and partners Templars Law firm -who will provide additional legal workshops in expert witness services in the judicial system, to the WARIF Rape Crisis Centre medical personnel.

Under our *Educational pillar*, the girls secondary educational program continues to expand its reach, with the support of Cummins West Africa, to Port Harcourt and Abuja with 450 selected girls participating in the school program and almost 200 parents in the parents forum organized by WARIF in each location.

The Community Service pillar commenced with the second cycle of the Ford Foundation Gatekeepers project in the southwestern region of the county-Lagos, Oyo and Ogun states with 700 traditional Birth attendants to be trained this year as first responders in tackling cases of GBV in their respective states We thank our partners, friends of WARIF and allies in the cause, both old and new for the continued support. WARIF PARTNERS WITH CUMMINS ON THE WARIF EDUCATIONAL SCHOOL PROGRAM IN 3 STATES

The WARIF Educational School Program (WESP) has continued to impact positively on the lives of school-age girls both directly and indirectly. This impact was felt at the just concluded WESP, sponsored by Cummins. in three senior secondary schools across three states in Nigeria - Rivers, Abuja, and Lagos states.

Over 600 girls were equipped with the knowledge and tools to prevent gender-based violence and act in the event of an encounter with a survivor of rape and other forms of abuse. Parents of these girls were not left out, as the Parent's Forum at each training highlighted the role that parents should play in the prevention of and breaking the silence around rape and sexual assault. Other impactful highlights of the WESP training involved Cummins award of a scholarship to one of the participants at Ogidigba Secondary School in Port Harcourt and the adoption of the school by Cummins for other CSR projects which would include the construction of classroom blocks and securing the school property.

WARIF LAYS THE GROUNDWORK FOR IMPLEMENTING THE GATEKEEPERS PROJECT IN OGUN AND OYO STATES

The Gatekeepers' Project is going to scale! Impressed by the success and impact of the Gatekeepers Project in Lagos, the Ford Foundation is backing WARIF to implement the Gatekeepers' project in Ogun and Oyo states. Led by the Program Manager of the Community Pillar, Ms. Adeola Potts-Johnson, the WARIF team embarked on a courtesy visit to both states to introduce WARIF and the Gatekeepers project and to solicit the support of the state in implementing the project. During its conversation with the Alternative Medicine Board in Ogun and Oyo states, the WARIF team touched on the prevalence of sexual violence and rape in communities and how it affects households; success stories from the previous Gatekeepers' Project carried out in Lagos; and the powerful role the Traditional Birth Attendants, who will be trained, play as first responders in reporting cases of rape and sexual violence in their various communities. The team also visited a Sexual Assault Referral Centre located in Laderin, Abeokuta, and another, the Spring Centre Abeokuta Ogun state, where the team met with Mrs. Seun Olapite the center manager. She explained the modus operandi of the center, was enthusiastic after learning about the Gatekeepers' Project and is willing to work with WARIF.

EU-UN SPOTLIGHT INITIATIVE - PREVENTION OF CAMPUS SEXUAL VIOLENCE IN TERTIARY INSTITUTIONS CYCLE 3

Ahead of the implementation of the Prevention of Campus Sexual Violence Program at the University of Calabar under the auspices of the EU-UN Spotlight Initiative; WARIF met with the Vice-Chancellor and some members of staff of the University to lay the groundwork for a smooth implementation. Conversations were held around how to have an inclusive program, not leaving behind persons living with disabilities, and other aspects of engaging the school community. WARIF PRESENT AT REGIONAL PARTNER GLOBAL CITIZEN'S "END EXTREME POVERTY NOW" CAMPAIGN

Global Citizens launched the "End Extreme Poverty Now" campaign identifying three transformative areas towards achieving this goal. These are advocacy and awareness, investment, and policy change. As regional partners with Global Citizen and a key player in eradicating all forms of gender-based violence through advocacy and awareness creation, WARIF is creating one of the biggest impacts in eradicating extreme poverty in Nigeria and was recognized by Global Citizen as one of the key stakeholders to achieving the campaign's goal.

WARIF ATTENDS A CONSULTATIVE MEETING ORGANIZED BY PARTNER GLOBAL CITIZENS

In the spirit of collaboration to end extreme poverty, Global Citizen (GC) in Nigeria invited WARIF to a consultative meeting to present its country strategy and to Identify areas of collaborative actions with CSOs like WARIF. Discussions were held on how to align actions locally and support local actors to achieve improved health outcomes for women and girls amongst her global goals. WARIF was represented at the consultative meeting by its Head of General Services and Communications Lead.





WARIF PARTICIPATES IN ROLAC WORKSHOP TO ESTABLISH A LEGAL FRAMEWORK FOR CHILD ABUSE INVESTIGATIONS

The British Council through its Rule of Law and Anti-Corruption Programme (RoLAC) organized a consultative workshop on the development and implementation of a legal framework for child abuse investigations and interview protocol. The Forensic Interview process was proposed as a best practice in the investigation of child sexual abuse cases, WARIF's Clinical Head, Dr. Annie Makanjuola presented WARIF's Medical Forensic Examination process at the consultation, showing how it impacts on administration of the criminal justice system.



WARIF CELEBRATES INTERNATIONAL DAY OF THE AFRICAN CHILD

As part of our activities to celebrate the Day of the African Child 2022, WARIF, facilitated a sensitization program organized by the Centre for Response and Prevention of Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (CRPSGBV) and the Lagos State University (LASU). Using interactive games, WARIF educated the pupils of the LASU staff school and students of LASU International Secondary School on the harmful practice of Sexual and Gender-Based Violence and steps to take in reporting and speaking up against the practice.
