All 3 pillars of the organization have had an impactful second quarter in 2023. A media parley hosted by WARIF with a select group of key media professionals from various publication houses and TV stations was held where the urgent issues of sexual and gender-based violence (SGBV) in Nigeria and the impact of many of these programs were discussed. Re-commitments were made by the media to highlight these issues responsibly and raise further awareness across the country.

The WARIF Rape Crisis Centre continues to see and record more cases daily at the facility and our trained forensic medical examiners serve as expert witnesses in ongoing court cases, ensuring all women and girls receive the justice they rightly deserve. The Centre has also continued in partnership with the Centre for Integrated Health Program to provide essential services to survivors at the WARIF Rape Crisis Centre with survivors receiving transformative support.

Under our *Educational pillar*, the WARIF Girls Educational School Program (WESP) continues to expand its reach. With the support of SONY Music, 600 girls in Lagos and Ogun State recently participated in the program. We are thrilled to report the remarkable success of this program and our new partnership. Also noteworthy is the landmark achievement of the passage of the "Mandatory Inclusion of Preventive Measures on Sexual and Gender-Based Violence into the Curriculum of all levels of Secondary Schools in Nigeria Bill on the 7th of June 2023 strongly advocated for WARIF and other civil society organizations.

The Community Service pillar concluded with the first cycle of the Ford Foundation Gatekeepers project in the southwestern region of the country in Lagos, Oyo, and Ogun states with 700 traditional birth attendants trained this year as first responders in tackling cases of GBV in their respective states. In addition, we are excited that ACT Foundation has also commenced with a 3rd cycle of the Gate Keepers project with WARIF in Ogun state, ensuring further expansion of this highly impactful project in the southwestern region of Nigeria.

Once again, I would like to thank our partners, friends of WARIF, and allies in the cause, both old and new for their continued support. We are indeed stronger together!

WARIF MEDIA PARLEY: REAFFIRMING OUR UNWAVERING COMMITMENT TO SUPPORTING SURVIVORS OF RAPE AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE IN NIGERIA



With a continued pursuit of advocacy for violence against women and girls and the support of all survivors, WARIF recently hosted a media parley to address the urgent issues of sexual and gender-based violence (SGBV) in Nigeria. A select group of key media professionals from various publication houses and TV stations were invited to dialogue, exchange knowledge, and updated information on the organization's road map and impact on the journey to recovery for many survivors across the country under our 3 pillars unique framework in successfully tacking the issue of SGBV.

The importance of utilizing both traditional and new media platforms and building significant partnerships with various media organizations to expand the reach of noteworthy information was also highlighted. Through strategic training and technical support, our goal is to empower media professionals to effectively disseminate information and raise awareness about SGBV. Media organizations such as Punch, Vanguard, Daily Independent, Leadership, WAZOBIA, Megalectrics, Daily Sun, and Business Day were all present at the Parley.

The Centre for Integrated Health Program (CIHP) and WARIF partnership to date has had a significant impact in providing essential services to survivors at the WARIF Rape Crisis Centre. In the first quarter alone, the joint efforts have resulted in transformative support for 49 survivors. This collaboration with CIHP and our shared supporting commitment to survivors and combatting sexual violence across Nigeria has had a lasting difference in the lives of survivors, offering essential services, care, and support when they need it the most. We remain dedicated to our mission and look forward to further strengthening this impactful partnership.



SONY MUSIC COLLABORATES WITH WARIF TO TRAIN ADOLESCENT GIRLS ON RAPE AND SEXUAL ASSAULT

WARIF is proud to announce the impactful partnership with SONY Music with the implementation of the WARIF Educational School Program (WESP) -WESP to 600 girls in Lagos and Ogun State. We are thrilled to report the remarkable success of this program, a specifically designed curriculum developed to empower young adolescent schoolgirls between the ages of 13 and 15 years of age. This transformative program provides these girls with essential knowledge and practical tools to identify signs of sexual assault and rape, equipping them to protect themselves and prevent such incidents from occurring. To date, well over 4000 secondary school girls throughout Nigeria have had the opportunity of participating in this life-changing initiative.

Senate passes bill to mandate teaching against sexual, genderbased violence in schools


On the 7th of June, the National Senate of the Federal Republic of Nigeria passed the bill to mandate teaching against sexual. gender-based violence in schools. At a plenary session presided over by Deputy Senate President Ovie Omo-Agege, the Senate approved a bill titled "Mandatory Inclusion of Preventive Measures on Sexual Gender-Based Violence and into the Curriculum of all levels of Secondary Schools in Nigeria Bill, 2023". The legislation, sponsored by Senate Leader Ibrahim Gobir, seeks to require secondary school authorities to incorporate lessons on preventing sexual and gender-based violence into their curriculum for students. Mr. Gobir said compulsory inclusion of Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV) in the school curriculum will expose secondary students to the dangers involved in committing the act.

We are proud of the role Civil Society Organizations such as WARIF and Women Advocates Research and Documentation Centre (WARDC) working in tertiary institutions, have played in advocating for this bill and look forward to the positive impact this will bring to universities and institutions of higher learning across the country.

SCHOOL- RELATED GENDER BASED VIOLENCE TEAMS IN TERTIARY INSTITUTIONS LAUNCHED THE #WETINBEYOUROWN CAMPAIGN

The selected tertiary institutions in Lagos, Abuja, and Calabar states, under the *WARIF Prevention of Campus Sexual Violence in tertiary institutions in Nigeria*, organized a campaign tagged #Wetinbeyourown to highlight the issues of gender-based violence and the different reporting systems available to survivors in their various schools. The #Wetinbeyourown campaign is an online campaign, aimed at raising awareness around the issues of sexual harassment on campuses and advocating for a change in behavior towards sexual harassment. Sexual harassment on campus negatively impacts the personal dignity and safety of students in tertiary institutions and disrupts their educational experience, interfering with their ability to reach their full potential academically and in life. A total number of 6 tertiary institutions participated in this online campaign, reaching over 10 million people across different social media platforms.





NGX JOINS FORCES WITH WARIF TO RAISE AWARENESS AMONG WOMEN IN RURAL COMMUNITIES

In the month of April, the Know Your Community Program by WARIF, in partnership with the Nigerian Exchange Group, conducted a sensitization campaign for women and girls residing in the Mushin Local Government Area of Lagos. The focus was on raising awareness about the effects of rape and sexual assault and the participants were educated on appropriate responses following incidents of abuse, including seeking medical services at facilities like the WARIF Rape Crisis Centre and reporting cases of rape and sexual abuse to law enforcement agencies. The WARIF team was accompanied by Mr. Dayo Adenubi, the Corporate Sustainability and Responsibility Consultant, and Ms. Ugochi Obi, the Head of X-Academy at Nigeria Exchange Group.



Both speakers emphasized the significance of financial independence and shared strategies for cultivating the habit of saving, regardless of the amount. They highlighted that many instances of violence against women and girls occur due to survivors' financial dependence on their abusers.

WARIF x FORD FOUNDATION PARTNER TO COMBAT GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE IN OGUN, OYO, AND LAGOS STATES



WARIF has partnered with Ford Foundation on the expansion of the Gatekeepers Project with its implementation in 3 Southwestern states - Lagos, Oyo, and Ogun states, to tackle the pervasive issue of GBV. The project focuses on empowering community stakeholders to effectively respond to cases of rape and sexual violence, with particular emphasis on young girls and women in rural areas. This successful initiative was carried out in 5 Local Government Areas in Lagos state, 4 Local Government Areas in Ogun, and 5 Local Government Areas in Oyo state. A total, of 1,050 gatekeepers - primary traditional birth attendants -were trained as first responders to cases of GBV within their communities, Interpersonal and professional relationships between the various community leaders and stakeholders are also strengthened through the Gatekeepers Program ensuring a broader community engagement and reach and the safety of women and girls.

ACT FOUNDATION, IN COLLABORATION WITH WARIF, EMBARKS ON A NEW PHASE OF THE WARIF GATE KEEPER'S PROJECT IN LAGOS AND OGUN STATE

With the support of ACT Foundation, WARIF has successfully trained 1,300 Traditional Birth Attendants (TBAs) in 18 Local Government Areas (LGAs) within Lagos. This training equips TBAs to act as first responders at the community level to cases of Gender-Based Violence (GBV). The TBAs utilize a comprehensive toolkit to identify GBV cases among girls and women in their communities, accurately record and document incidents of rape and sexual violence and provide initial support and counseling to survivors



Through this initiative, 684 survivors have already benefited from medical services at the WARIF Rape Crisis Centre, thanks to referrals made by TBAs from rural communities in the previous ACT Foundation x WARIF Gatekeepers project.

Building on the success of the project, the ACT Foundation x WARIF partnership is now entering a 4th cycle with the expansion of the Gatekeepers Project to an additional 200 TBAs from Ogun State. These TBAs will receive the comprehensive training and resources to raise awareness, support survivors of rape and other forms of GBV, and continue providing essential first responder care and services to survivors in their respective rural communities. With the continued support of ACT Foundation, this project will make a tangible and positive difference in the lives of GBV survivors across the Southwestern region of Nigeria and contribute to the prevention and eradication of GBV in the region.

During the AXA Week for Good, AXA Mansard and WARIF joined forces to organize a series of impactful initiatives aimed at combating sexual and gender-based violence. Under the theme "Rescue HER", activities such as a session on Employee Sensitization on Women's Conditions and Sexual and Gender-Based Violence, the AXA Mansard HER/WARIF Girls' Proiect Rescue were implemented, as well as a radio talk show addressing Sexual and Gender-Based Violence and the AXA Mansard Rescue HER x WARIF SGBV Awareness Walk. These collaborative endeavors demonstrate the unwavering commitment of both organizations to address the issue of sexual and gender-based violence, raise awareness, empower individuals and to become catalysts for change.


